Attracting investment: Higher Education Case Studies

Ballarat Technology Park

- IBM
- Now 30 companies, e.g. Emergency Services Telecommunications Authority; State Revenue Office
- 1,400 people
- \$100 million into regional household income annually

Attracting investment: Higher Education Case Studies

Wollongong Innovation Campus

- Purpose: economic transition and job creation
- 33 hectares gifted by Council
- Local Environment Plan and Development Control Plan supported by State Government
- Project grants provided by State Government
- Project grants provided by Commonwealth Government through EIF and election promises
- Local members bring international investors through the campus

Attracting investment: Higher Education Case Studies

CQUniversity Mackay Ooralea Sports Precinct

- CQUniversity to provide 12 hectares of land
- Council has committed \$10 million
- Commonwealth election promise of \$10 million from Stronger Regions Fund

Attracting investment: Higher Education Case Studies

USQ Agriculture Research

- State Government grants of \$3.5m for drought resilience R&D and \$90m for irrigation and water management R&D
- DAF – Broadacre Agriculture Institute partnership
- Toowoomba Surat Basin Enterprise partnership
- DFAT – Australian Water partnership
- Major industry conferences

Attracting investment: Higher Education Case Studies

Charles Sturt University Dentistry School

- Expansion of public dental services in cooperation with local government and the dental profession
- New pre-clinical and clinical facilities in Orange and Wagga Wagga; dental education clinics in Albury, Bathurst and Dubbo
- Commonwealth commitment of \$65m over four years (infrastructure, work placements, student places)

Swimming

- In partnership with USC Spartans, have received State support for a pool expansion
 - To occur in 2017
- Development will include:
 - A warm water multi-purpose 25m, 6 lane, graduated depth pool
 - Cold immersion plunge pools
 - Related facilities
 - Walk-through shower
 - Consultation rooms
 - Change rooms
 - Reception entry
 - Gym expansion



New facilities: USC Health and Sport Precinct

New facility uses:

- Swim training programs for people with a disability
- Recovery training programs for athletes
- Post-injury training programs for members of the community
- Training of trainers for future aquatic exercise specialists
