


### Providing a hand up to a safer life

A client assisted in the Brisbane area wrote to us about the help she received when she needed it most.

I am writing to you today to say thank you for our assistance during a very trying time in my family's life. My children and I had to escape domestic violence, we had to flee for our lives and leave everything behind. St Vincent de Paul Society came to the rescue as we arrived at a Catholic Church on the Southside of Brisbane. We arrived at the church with the clothes we were wearing and two plastic bags of clothing three pillows and very tired children. The Conference provided us with furniture, household goods, clothing , food and financial assistance for the children's schooling and we now have a lovely little house to call home. It is with tears in my eyes that I wrote to you today, on a borrowed computer and sitting at my donated desk.

In the last twelve months the Northern Díocese Homelessness Support Program had 240 support períods opened

- ▶ 61% male
- ➤ 39% female
- 14% Aborígínal or Torres Straít Islander
- > 68% had been homeless in the past month
- > 71% homeless in the past year.

In the week before interview 75 people had been sleeping in a tent, a car or on the street/park.

65% of people assisted are on Newstart or Disability Allowances.

20% of people assisted had at least one child.


At the close of their support period, 33% of people had been assisted into tenancies in units/houses/caravan parks/transitional housing/community housing/social housing. 23 unknown due to loss of contact.



What the literature tells us very clearly is that work remains an important source of identity, meaning and social affiliation (work Employment & Society March 2009 vol. 23 no. 1 p. 84-101).

The economic costs of unemployment or underemployment, as demonstrated throughout the day, are manifest in the cost burden the Social and Health consequences impose on our community, as well as the loss of young people from the Region as they search for work elsewhere.
