Regional universities around Australia make a significant contribution to regional economies.

Jonathan Chew, Director - Nous Group, is the lunch speaker. Jonathan will present the findings of a recent in-depth economic modelling study for the Regional Universities Network* which quantifies the contribution of regional universities including the University of the Sunshine Coast.

The presentation will outline how to conceptualise the economic contribution of regional universities in terms of three dimensions: (1) student and university spending, (2) jobs and productivity, and (3) innovation and knowledge. The presentation will also outline the key areas where improved performance and policy conditions can drive regional universities to have an even greater impact on local economies in the future.

*Members of the Regional Universities Network (RUN) are CQ University, Federation University Australia, Southern Cross University, University of New England, University of Southern Queensland and University of the Sunshine Coast.

Location and Parking:
