





ABOUT THE SLEEPOUT

ST VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY (VINNIES) IS CELEBRATING ITS 125 YEARS OF SERVICE IN QUEENSLAND IN 2019, INCLUDING MORE THAN 90 YEARS ON THE SUNSHINE COAST.

Over the last seven years on the Sunshine Coast, Vinnies has held six Corporate and Community Sleepouts. As a result we have been able to:

- Purchase nine units in Maroochydore, a commitment of \$1.6 million, as well as repairs and refurbishments of a further \$200,000
- Help raise awareness of the issue of homelessness and those people at risk of homelessness in our region.

On 8 August we invite your support for the event to be held at Maroochy Surf Club.

Participants will be provided with a "basic" meal, with the opportunity to learn a little about homelessness and who this can affect, all while sleeping legally on the beach at Maroochydore.







WHAT WE DO

ON THE SUNSHINE COAST WE PROVIDE ASSISTANCE TO THOSE WHO ARE EXPERIENCING HARDSHIP THROUGH:

VINNIES SHOPS & FAMILY SUPPORT OFFICES

Vinnies shops sell quality donated clothing, furniture and homewares at a low cost. There are over 150 shops throughout Queensland and many have a family support office attached. Family support offices facilitate the provision of in-kind goods and services to people in need.

CORNERSTONE MOBILE YOUTH HOMELESS SUPPORT PROGRAM

Cornerstone Mobile Youth Homeless Support are a local team on the Sunshine Coast, supporting young people (16-25) who are either homeless or at risk of homelessness to find safe and secure independent living.

HOMELESSNESS SUPPORT PROGRAM

The Homelessness Support Program offers case management for people on the Sunshine Coast aged 18 years and over who are experiencing homelessness or at risk of homelessness.

HOUSING

Northern Diocese has a range of housing and accommodation facilities including a 41 unit social housing community, a 17 unit transitional housing facility and the recently purchased nine units at Maroochydore.

VISITATION

Home and in-care visitation to reduce social isolation

CHILD AND FAMILY PROGRAM

The Child and Family Program operates in the Wide Bay Burnett, Gympie and Sunshine Coast regions. The program works with the Department of Child Safety to support families to address complex and sensitive child protection concerns. The ultimate aim of the program is to see children remain in the care of their parents.

FOOD

Vinnies runs services that collect food and distribute it to people in need and also has a low cost Food Division located in Gympie.

WHAT WE DO

YOUTH

The Northern Vinnies Youth
Department aims to connect with
young people to give a hand up to
those in need. Youth staff work with
schools to raise funds, goods and
awareness for local social justice
issues. Young adult members and
volunteers offer programs to
marginalised children and teens
through Buddies Days and VOICE
programs.

VISITATION

Vinnies members visit people in their homes to help them find appropriate responses to their needs, which is often support, friendship and/or material assistance.

PRISONER SUPPORT

Vinnies recently established a Prisoner Support Conference which assists prisoners leaving Woodford prison which includes short term accommodation, food and travel assistance and helping to connect prisoners back to family.
